

**Jewelry luminary to speak**

EL PASO -- Adam Heyman of New York's prestigious Oscar Heyman Brothers, which created jewelry for Elizabeth Taylor and other celebrities, will speak at 7 p.m. Thursday in the El Paso Museum of Art's El Paso Energy Auditorium.

"The Art of Creating Heirloom Jewelry Since 1912" is the title of the lecture, in conjunction with the museum's exhibition titled "Bedazzled: 5,000 Years of Jewelry." The talk is free, but there's a \$15 charge for a pre-lecture cocktail reception with Heyman at 6:15 p.m. Those who attend that discussion will be allowed in free to see the exhibit from 8:15 to 8:45 that night. Admission is usually \$10; \$5 for museum members.

The lecture series is sponsored and organized by Susan Eisen Fine Jewelry and Watches, the exhibit's main sponsor. "Bedazzled" will be up through July 25.
